About the Club

In 1996, when Keith and Lisa Sheckler were getting ready to get married, a suggestion was made to have a bachelor party. Someone said, "Let's have a Laser race!" So Betts Byrd and Lisa were race committee. Racers were Thor Seaborg, Scott Richardson, Steve Wright, Steve Dechart, Marc DeLaVergne, and Keith. Everyone had a great time and agreed that it had been way too long since we'd had organized racing. Thor suggested we form a club. Keith added that he, Marc DeLaVergne, and Dave Cox had started to make that effort in the late 80s, but lost momentum. They had started making up a set of bylaws, and had each put \$25 down to start a bank account. That bank account still existed and is now our current account!

So, during the winter of 96-97 the club was formed. The newly formed club eagerly anticipated the approaching sailing season and race schedule, but there was a problem! Lots of water! The spring of 97 brought lake levels 3 feet above summer pool, which didn't recede until almost July.

When the water receded and things were back to normal the Sheckler family wanted to put on a barbeque for their customers as a thank you for patience and cooperation during the flooding. Combining the relief of the flood danger being over, the sailing season finally being underway, and the barbeque with good friends, it was a wonderful time! Everyone said this should be an annual event, hence the Spring Barbeque! Gina Woodruff took charge of adding the milk carton race to the Spring Barbeque to create something fun for the younger sailors, but soon found out—We're all young!

Since FUN was a priority setting up the club, and the spring barbeque was a hit, aaaaand there lots of condiments left over, it was decided "Lets do it again in the fall". Hence the fall barbeque!

The inaugural season of SSA provided, a couple of dinghy races, a couple of cat races, and a couple of keel races, in addition to the Thursday races. We had no money in the budget for trophies of any kind. Thor donated a shoe to present as the first trophy.

In the years that followed other races were added, buoy races, long distance, single hand, jack and jill and of course the world famous labor day weekend Spud Cup. Along with racing the club has developed and presents sailing workshops throughout the year, youth and adult sailing classes and many social events. The club owns and maintains 5 14' Hobie Holder sailboats and 1 Capri 18 for member use. Check out the website for more details on how to get signed off and use the club boats.

The stated purpose of the club is:

- To provide, facilitate, sponsor, and organize recreational boating activities for members and the general public;
- To provide educational resources for youth and adults.
- And to promote safety and competence during water-related functions.

Registration

SSA Membership and Race Registration forms are included in this book, available online and will be available prior to the start of each race at Fred's deck. Completed race registration forms and fees are required prior to participation in each race.

Race Fees:

Thursday night racing begin on June 6 and end on Saturday, September 14. There are 13 races during the summer, with the final race taking place on a Saturday). SSA membership for skippers and regular crew is strongly encouraged.

The fee for participating in SSA Summer races is \$10 per race or \$100 for all the SSA Sunday Races (two of which are scheduled on Saturdays). The summer races include:

The fee for participating in the Festival Cup is \$20 and includes both Tuesday Races.

Fees for J24 one design racing are collected through the J24 fleet.

Requirements

- Skippers are required to be current SSA members to participate in any SSA supported race. A 2 race grace period is allowed. (Crew members are also highly encouraged to become SSA members).
- The skipper and crew will abide by the Sailing Instructions and follow principles of sportsmanship and fair play.
- The boat owner will have valid third-party liability insurance.
- All participants acknowledge that the decision to race is their own.
- All Sunday SSA race and Thursday night competitors are required to run Committee at least once in order to qualify for end of year scoring.

Thursday Night Races

HOST CLUB: Sandpoint Sailing Association located on Lake Pend Oreille at the Windbag Marina (adjacent to City Beach) in Sandpoint, Idaho.

RULES: The races shall be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).

FLEETS: There is only one fleet for Thursday Night Races - the fun fleet.

HANDICAPPING: There is no scoring for Thursday Night Races, kudos may be given to the boat taking line honors AND having the most fun.

REGISTRATION: There is no registration required for Thursday Night Races.

SCHEDULE: Dates: June 6, 13, 20, 27, July 11, 18, 25, August 15, 22, 29, September 5, 14 (Saturday)

- 5:30 pm Skippers meeting at Fred's deck or at a location designated by race committee
- 6 ish pm First Warning Signal (Reasonable time will be given to boat to get to the line)
- The race committee will conclude racing in time for boats to return to the Windbag Marina before dark.

COURSES: Course is typically windward/leeward but may vary and will be determined by the race committee and explained at the skippers meeting. Usually races will be one or two laps. Typical race duration will be between 60 to 90 minutes.

TIME LIMIT: 90 minutes for the first boat in fleet and for other boats 30 minutes after the first boat their fleet sails the course.

SCORING: There is no scoring for Thursday Night Races.

INSURANCE: All boats must carry liability insurance.

REGISTRATION FEE: \$0

Thursday night races are intended to be fun, practice races open to new sailors and visitors wanting to crew. All skippers are encouraged to invite new sailors and visitors hoping to find a ride aboard for a fun night of racing.

Notice of Race SSA Summer Race Series

HOST CLUB: Sandpoint Sailing Association located on Lake Pend Oreille at the Windbag Marina (adjacent to City Beach) in Sandpoint, Idaho.

MEMBERSHIP: Membership in the Sandpoint Sailing Association (SSA) is required to compete in SSA supported racing. Non-members can participate in individual races, but their scores will be excluded from the race series. A two race-grace period is allowed. Scores during the grace period will be counted if memberships are later obtained.

SSA 2019 General Sailing Instructions

1. RULES

- 1.1 All races will be governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).
- 1.2 Changes to the rules may be noted elsewhere in the Notice of Race or Sailing Instructions. If the Notice of Race and Sailing Instructions are in conflict, the Sailing Instructions have precedence.

2. NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

- 2.1 Notices to competitors will be announced prior to races via e-mail communication, posted on the website or at the skippers meeting.
- 2.2 The race committee may provide unofficial communication, which is communication not governed by the rules, at any time by hail or over VHF. A request for redress may not be based on any aspect of unofficial communication, including content, timeliness, or failure to hear. This changes RRS 62.1(a).
- 2.3 The preferred VHF radio channel will be 72.

3. CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

3.1 Changes to the Sailing Instructions will be posted on the website, sent via email or announced at the skippers meeting.

4. SCHEDULE

4.1 See NOR for race schedules.

5. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 5.1 Signals made ashore will be made on the committee boat flag poles. The committee will attempt courtesy broadcasts on VHF radio channel 72.
- 5.2 In the event of an on-shore postponement, no starting signal will be made earlier than thirty (30) minutes following the lowering of the signal flag. This changes "Race Signals AP and AP over H".

6. RACING AREA AND RACE COMMITTEE SIGNAL BOAT

- 6.1 The racing area will be East to Northeast of City Beach.
- 6.2 The race committee signal boat will be the SSA pontoon boat. The race committee signal boat will be displaying the orange start/finish flag.
- 6.3 If necessary, an alternate race committee signal boat may be used.

7. FLEETS

- 7.1 There will be a spinnaker flying fleet and a non-spinnaker flying fleet, a one design fleet with at least five boats may request their own start.
- 7.2 The fleet lists will be announced at the Skippers Meeting prior to racing.

8. COURSES

- 8.1 Courses will typically be windward / leeward and may include gates, offsets, and gybe marks. See course map.
- 8.2 Marks A, B, L, X, Y, Z shall be left to port.
- 8.3 Courses will be 2 laps.
- 8.4 Short courses will be 1 lap. This changes RRS 32.2.

9. THE START

9.1 The starting line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the race committee signal boat and the course side of the starting mark buoy.

- 9.2 If a boat is subject to RRS 29.1, Individual Recall, or RRS 30, Starting Penalties, the race committee may attempt to hail her sail number directly and on VHF. This is unofficial communication as in Sailing Instructions 2.2.
- 9.3 A boat starting later than ten minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start (DNS) without a hearing. This changes RRS A5.
- 9.4 A boat whose warning signal has not been made shall avoid the starting area when other boats are racing but have not yet started.
- 9.5 The race committee signal boat, when a starting mark, may maneuver to maintain the starting line at any time, including while anchored.

10. THE FINISH

- 10.1 The finishing line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the race committee signal boat and the course side of the finishing mark buoy.
- 10.2 The race committee may adjust the finishing marks to maintain the finishing line without regard to RRS 33.
- 10.3 The race committee may designate an alternative finishing line. The finishing line will be announced at the Skippers Meeting prior to start of racing.

11. TIME LIMIT

- 11.1 If no boat sails the course and finishes within 90 minutes after her start, the race will be abandoned. Boats failing to finish within 30 minutes after the first boat in her class sails the course and finishes, will be scored Did Not Finish without a hearing. This changes RRS 35, A4 and A5.
- 11.2 Race Committee may designate a long distance course. Sailing Instruction 11.1 shall not apply to a long distance course.

12. PROTESTS AND PENALTIES

- 12.1 A boat intending to protest or request redress shall notify the race committee as soon as reasonably possible after retiring or finishing. This changes RRS 61.1(a).
- 12.2 Written protests and requests for redress shall be delivered within the protest time limit to the race committee.
- 12.3 The protest time limit will be 45 minutes after the end of the last race for the class each day or 30 minutes after committee returns to the dock, whichever is later.
- 12.4 Hearings may commence at any time if parties are informed, present and prepared. A hearing time and place will be posted at the official notice board. The communication of the hearing shall be considered notice as required by 63.2.
- 12.5 A boat may take a One-Turns Penalty when she may have broken one or more rules of Part 2 in an incident while *racing*, unless she is within 3 of her hull lengths of a mark she is required to leave on one side, in which case a Two-Turns Penalty may be taken. This changes RRS 44.1.

13. SCORING

- 13.1 Rule A2.1 applies. (See Notice of Race Addendum #1)
- 13.2 Time on time handicapping will be used for PHRF fleets, not One Design fleets.

14. SAFETY

- 14.1 A boat that retires from a race shall notify the race committee as soon as possible.
- 14.2 Competitors participate in racing entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race.
- 14.3 The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained prior to, in conjunction with, or after racing.

A note about handicap ratings and time on time scoring

Handicapped fleets are handicapped using ratings assigned by the Sandpoint Sailing Association. Those ratings will be based on the most readily available information at the time. The Rear Commodore or designee will research the type and model of boat and assign a rating based on that research. If skipper disagrees with the assigned rating they are welcome to get a rating through PHRF-NW by following their application process. The SSA will accept previous PHRF-NW ratings. The assigned rating will be applied to all races regardless of whether the skipper chooses to fly the spinnaker or not.

Races are handicapped using time-on-time scoring with the Time Correction Factor (TCF) calculated as follows:

TCF = 700 ÷ (550 + rating)

Rating is the yacht's assigned handicap rating. The numerator, 700, is called the A factor. The 550 in the denominator is called the B factor. The A factor is simply a scaling factor and it has no effect on the placing of yachts after scoring. The A factor is typically set to value equal to the B factor plus the average handicap rating in the fleet. When done this way, the TCF for a yacht rated at the average rating is one, so that yacht's corrected time is equal to her actual elapsed time. SSA's formula is based on an average rating of 150. For a yacht rating 150, its TCF is $700 \div (550 + 150) = 1$. To calculate the yacht's corrected time, its elapsed time is multiplied by the TCF, so in the case of yacht with a handicap rating of 150, its corrected time is equal to its elapsed time. Again, the A factor has no effect on the outcome of the race, but the closer it is to a yacht's rating plus the B factor, the closer the yacht's corrected time will be to her actual elapsed time. The B factor, on the other hand, must be chosen carefully as it can impact the scoring. US Sailing recommends a B factor of 480 for heavy air or all offwind races, 550 for average conditions and 600 for light air or all windward races. SSA uses US Sailing's recommendation for average conditions as it seems the fairest given our typical conditions.
